Opening: Read Psalm 105. From the passage/sermon, what truths impacted you the most?

1. Read verses 1-6.

a. List the commands to which we're being called.

b. Share with the group some of the ways God has worked in your life.

c. How can you make thankfulness, and testifying to God's work in you, a regular part of your life?

2. In verse 4, we're called to seek the Lord and his strength, and to do it continually.

a. What area(s) of your life are you in need of his strength?

b. How are you being called to seek him in that area?

c. What is keeping you from pursuing him continually in that struggle?

3. From verses 7-11:

a. What do you learn about God's promises?

b. How are they encouraging to you?

4. Isaiah 7:9b says: "If you are not firm in faith, you will not be firm at all."

a. In what areas are you struggling to have faith?

b. We see the full story of the Israelites' struggle, provision and blessing in verses 12-45. How does understanding the whole story impact your faith?

Application: In what area(s) of your life do you need to have an eternal perspective? What promises of God will help you replace your doubts, even while you're in the "middle" of your story?
