- d. What about this passage is hard for you to follow?
- 4. Read Psalm 15:1-5.
 - a. Describe the character traits of the person who "dwells on God's holy hill" from this passage.
 - b. How did Daniel's life model this description?
 - c. According to 2 Corinthians 3:16-18, how can we have these character traits in our own lives?

Application: In what areas of your life do you need to grow in trusting the Lord? How will you lean on Him instead of your own understanding, and acknowledge Him so that you can grow in that trust?
