Lesson Summary:

In Exodus 17:8-15, the Amalekites attacked the Israelites. Moses told Joshua to gather men so they could fight them. While the battle was occurring the next day, Moses stood on a hill with the staff of God held up high in his hands. Whenever the staff was lowered, the Israelites were losing the battle. When the staff was high, they would be winning the battle.

This was an unusual way to fight in a battle. When Moses' hands were high, it represented full dependence upon the Lord. Then, when they were lowered, it showed a lack of dependence upon God alone. The victory of this battle for the Israelites showed God's full power on display. They didn't win using their own strength. Instead, they won by God's power alone. After this victory, Moses built an altar to God, naming it "The Lord is my Banner." This was a reminder of the Lord's faithfulness in being with them in every trial. We can remember that no matter what we may face, God is always with us.

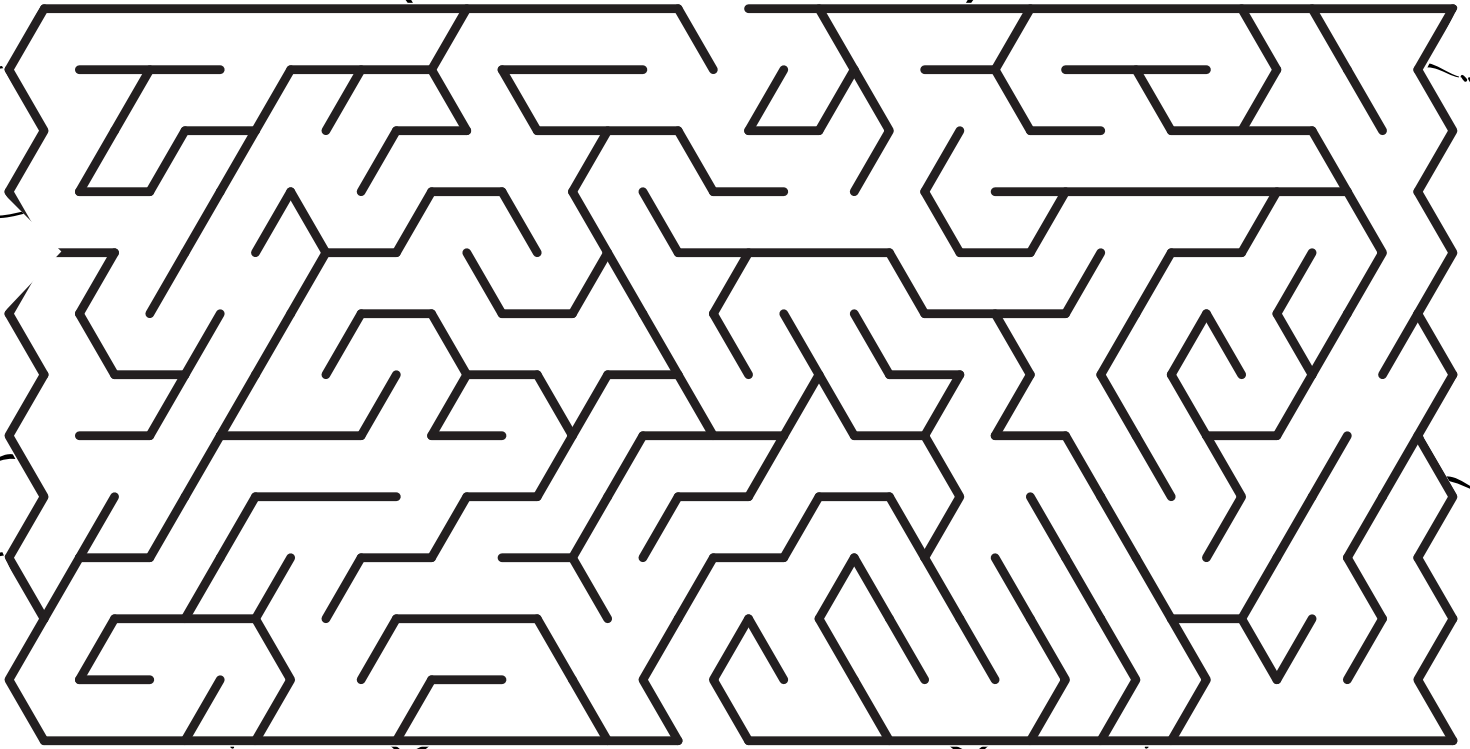
