Bible Summary

On Sunday, we learned God saved Noah, his family, and the animals on the ark during the flood. God saved Noah and He can save you too. During the time when Noah was alive, the people on Earth did not have faith in the Lord and they were not obeying Him. Noah had faith though. He and his family loved God and did their best to obey Him. When God told Noah He was going to flood the earth and told Noah to build an ark, Noah had faith in the Lord, trusted Him, and obeyed Him by building the ark. Some might think it would be fun to be on a big boat with all types of animals, but I bet it was pretty hard too. It was probably pretty smelly and Noah and his family might have missed being able to go outside and walk around. God didn't promise Noah it would be easy on the ark, but He did promise to save them from the flood. God has planned from the very beginning to make a way to save all who trust in Him too. God's plan from the very beginning has been for Jesus to be our Savior. When He died on the cross and rose again three days later, He made a way for our sins to be forgiven, saving us from the punishment of sin, and made a way for us to live with Him forever.

Digging Deeper

Ask your child to retell you the story of Noah and the flood or read the story together from a Bible. How did Noah show his faith in the Lord? What happened to Noah and everyone on the ark during the flood. What would it have been like on the ark? Would it have been fun all the time? Still God saved Noah. Remind them of God's promise to save us and ask them to tell you how Jesus saves. Do they have any questions? Talk with your child about what it means to be saved and pray together as a family.
