Passage Jeremiah 31:31-34

Main Point God keeps all His promises.

Application I can trust God to do what He says.

Bible Summary

For the past few weeks, we have been learning God is able to do all things, even when it might seem impossible. We have seen God show His power and keep His promises. Last week, we learned about God giving the Israelites victory in the town of Jericho. God had promised to give them this land and God keeps all His promises. The Israelites were not perfect people. They needed God to help them and give them victory over their enemies. After God brought the Israelites out of Egypt, He made a promise with them. If they obey Him, He would bless them. The Israelites could not obey God perfectly and none of us can obey Him perfectly. Satan is our enemy. He wants us to believe his lies and fall for his tricks to disobey God. God had a plan from the very beginning to defeat Satan. He used a prophet named Jeremiah, who He would one day make a new promise with His people. God said this promise would not be like the old promise God made before because under the new promise, He would forgive His people for their sins. When we disobey God, we call that a sin. We all sin and, like the Israelites, we can not save ourselves from our sins. We need Jesus. When we put our trust in Jesus, we become His, He forgives our sins, and He saves us from the punishment of our sins. When God makes a promise, He keeps it. When God says He will do something, He does it. We can be confident, no matter what, when we put our trust in Jesus, He is faithful to forgive our sins and make a way to live with Him forever.

Digging Deeper

What does it mean to sin? Can any of us obey God perfectly? Remind your child the Bible tells us we all sin, but Christ loves us so much, He died for us to make a way for our sins to be forgiven. He took our punishment. Talk about how much Jesus loves us, that He was willing to take our punishment. Pray together praising Him and thanking Him for being our Savior and making a way for us to be forgiven and to live with Him forever.
