

IMPACT GROUP QUESTIONS

KEY PASSAGE: HEBREWS 13:10-16

Opening: What truths impacted you most from the sermon/passage? *Do not make comfort or rest your goal in this sinful world. Follow the example of Jesus; Don't make Judaism or this broken world your home. Praise Him for your future home.*

INFORM THE HEAD / STIR THE HEART

1. In verse 10, the “altar” represents what we have in Jesus at the cross. The “tent” represents those that strive to be right with God from the Old Testament law apart from Jesus. Why would someone choose to trust in the law and their own actions rather than in Jesus?

2. The Old Testament law had many “types” (examples pointing to Jesus) surrounding sin sacrifice. After reading in vs 11 that the sacrificial animal had to be dragged outside the camp and burned to cover sin, how does that impact your worship knowing that it represented what Jesus would do for you?

3. In vs. 13, what is the “therefore” there for?

4. What does it look like for believers to go to Jesus “outside the camp and bear the reproach He endured”? Please compare your answer with John 12:42-43.

5. How do the following things hinder us from “bearing reproach” alongside of Jesus?

a. Wrong expectations

b. Wrong goals

c. Wrong understanding of God’s character

6. There is a quote that says, “Lord, help me view my circumstances in light of you, rather than you in light of my circumstances.” What truths about God from this passage must we cling to when facing reproach/trials?

CHALLENGE THE WILL

Based on what you learned in Sunday’s message and in your study time, what is one measurable thing you will go after this week in your walk with Christ?
