a. Why do you think the Jews were trying to stir people up against Paul?

b. In 2 Timothy 3:11, Paul said that God "delivered him from the persecutions." How did He deliver him?

c. What did Paul do after the people stoned him and what does this say about his faith?

4. How does vs. 12 compare to the health, wealth and prosperity gospel, and why do you think God allows Christians to be persecuted?

5. How does knowing that God knows that believers will be persecuted while evil people just keep getting worse affect your faith?

6. What do the following verses tell you about God's view of our suffering?

a. Isaiah 63:9

b. John 16:33

c. 1 Peter 1:6-7
