IMPACT GROUP QUESTIONS

KEY PASSAGE: HEBREWS 10:1-7

3. Why might we prefer to have some form of sacrifice today that we partake in rather than a relational approach to God where He has paid the cost in full?
4. Pastor Tim shared the statement, "Shame is a self-inflicted wound caused by standing on our own goodness, all the while knowing it is not enough." How is shame different from humility?

5. Please use the following scriptures to explain why God does not desire sacrifice, burnt offerings, and sin offerings? What does He want instead?
