3. Why is it so important that we have this confidence? How will it affect our approach to God without that confidence? What questions does it raise about God when we don't have that confidence?

4. Please look back at Hebrews 9:19-26. How is the sprinkling and washing of the new covenant mentioned in Hebrews 10:22 so much better than the shadow of the old?

5. Please explain the reason for holding fast our confession along with other lesser ways that we try to hold fast to what we say we believe. Why does God's way work, and why do the lesser ways not work?

6. Please explain the importance and benefits of relationships from vs. 24-25. What do we gain by the calling of these verses? What do we miss out on when we ignore these verses?
